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AIMS

This course aims to increase the awareness of participants about the role and responsibilities of a workplace fire warden and workplace emergency preparedness.

All businesses and organisations in Australia must have emergency planning procedures in place as per Australian Standard 3745-2010. Fire wardens play a key role in managing building emergencies that involve evacuation procedures during critical moments. Participants of this awareness course are introduced to the legal requirements under the WHS Act and Regulation regarding emergency preparedness, the role of the fire warden, responding to fire danger, evacuation procedures, raising alarms, fire fighting equipment, personnel requirements, and signage.
